Proposal:

Demolition of front boundary wall and gate pier, and replacement with metal railing/gate; erection of a bin store; installation of a dropped kerb and use of the front yard as car parking; new electric vehicle charging point; (Part retrospective).

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

- The creation of an on-site parking space would promote the use of private motor vehicles and fail to encourage the use of sustainable modes of transport. This is contrary to policies T1 (Prioritising walking, cycling and public transport), T2 (Parking and car free development) and A1 (Managing the impact of development) of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.
- The proposal by reason of the demolition of the brick boundary wall and the proposed fully openable railings, by reason of their materials and detailed design harms the character and appearance of the host property, streetscene and the wider conservation area, contrary to policies D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the London

Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017 and policies D3 (Design Principles) of the Kentish Town Neighbourhood Plan 2016.
