1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved document and drawings:

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

3 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting planning permission:

Section 72(1) of the Listed Buildings Act 1990 states In the exercise of various functions under the Planning Acts in relation to land in conservation areas (including determination of planning applications) the Council is required to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.

Section 66(1) of the Listed Buildings Act 1990 states In considering whether to grant planning permission for development which affects a listed building or its setting, the Council is required to have special regard to the desirability of preserving the listed building or its setting or any features of special architectural or historic interest which it possesses.

The proposed works involve minor alteration of existing windows, doors and provision of a small and relatively concealed access ladder. There is no meaningful alteration to the overall scale, character or appearance of the host building. The works preserve the character and appearance of the Bloomsbury Conservation Area and do not harm the setting of the neighbouring listed buildings.

The proposals would not harm the amenity or living conditions at any neighbouring sites. The site does not directly adjoin any residential sites and the proposed alterations would not result in any overlooking or loss of visual amenity at any neighbouring sites.

There are no other planning issues (e.g. sustainability, transport, ecology, flooding etc.) associated with the proposals.

The site's planning history and the planning history of the neighbouring sites have been taken into consideration in the assessment of the proposal.

As such, the proposal would not harm the townscape quality of the building, the significance of the Conservation Area or the amenity of any neighbouring occupiers. The proposal therefore complies with policies A1, D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan. It would also comply with the London Plan 2021 and the NPPF 2023.

Noise from demolition and construction works is subject to control under the Control of Pollution Act 1974. You must secure the approval of the Council's Noise and Licensing Enforcement Team prior to undertaking such activities outside these hours.
