DESIGN PARAMETERS

GROUND FLOOR PRIVATE GARDENS

Private gardens are to be provided to the rear of the ground floor apartments. A small paved patio area with seating is proposed allowing for a peaceful space for residents. This will offer a much needed sense escape from the city. Ornamental perennial planting is proposed to enclose the patios. Plants are to provide seasonal interest with emphasis on nectar rich flowers which provide vital habitat and food source for local wildlife. A large ornamental hedge is proposed along the boundary of the gardens to aid in screening the space and minimise overlooking from the adjacent Wellesley Road Care Home.

GROUNDFLOOR COMMUNAL GARDEN

A communal amenity space is provided to the rear of the development. The space will be completely accessible with ample seating situated throughout the space providing areas for both communal and independent activities. Lush ornamental shrub and hedge planting is being proposed to enclose the space and provide a sense of privacy while also offering a calming and attractive backdrop. The planting palette will focus on providing a sensory experience with the use of colour, form, scent, structure. Specimen trees are proposed (approx. 2m in height when planted)

to provide screening and block views from the adjacent buildings. The additional height of the trees will provide a sense of enclosure while also offering seasonal interest.

INTEGRATED EXTENSIVE GREEN ROOF

A integrated green roof system is to be proposed to the roof of the building. This is to encourage as much biodiversity into the site as possible. An integrated system would allow for the installation of PV panels while still allowing for the plants to prosper alongside.


