I am resident at 24 Harley Road, the house next door to this property. I object to destroying these mature and impressive trees.

Planning applications

2024/3599/T and 2024/3599/T

The trees provide a beautiful outlook and also privacy and screening, for both the Swiss Cottage Special Needs School and the UCL Academy School from residents in Harley Road.

They are important to provide privacy and screening for residents from each other and from the tall schools, which have windows at a high level which, were it not for the trees, would look directly into our bedrooms and living room.

In addition, these trees provide privacy and screening from the small cottage in the garden of 22B Harley Road. Reducing the trees would destroy that privacy and screening. There have been (rejected) applications to demolish and rebuild this cottage with much greater bulk and massing. If any such applications were to be resubmitted, the reduction of these trees would make the situation far, far worse.

Please note previous objections, which are repeated here.

Previous applications to these tree works were strenuously objected to by local residents, and were refused in 2001 when a TPO was served, refused again in

2003, and refused again less than a year ago in October 2023. We are steadfast in our objections.

We should be planting more trees and protecting our trees, not felling them to then apply for planning to significantly increase house mass.
