


Diagram (Not to Scale)

The roof itself is in a shape like this  on top of the building (the adjacent terraced buildings are the same). The skylight is in the middle of one of the slopes, and there is a pathway at the bottom of the slopes, so you can step out of the access skylight onto the path.



Approximate elevation of each slope is 35 degrees
