Assessment

The s.211 notice is for the removal of a contorted willow tree from the rear garden of a residential property that is situated within the Camden Town Conservation Area.

The willow is of low visibility from the public realm and is not considered to significantly contribute to the character and appearance of the conservation area.

The tree has been poorly pruned historically which has adversely affected its form. The tree is not considered a noteworthy example of its species and is not of a rare species. The tree is of no known cultural or historical value.
