## DECISION

Town and Country Planning Act 1990  
Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007

### Advertisement Consent Refused

**Pavement outside 133 Clerkenwell Road

Proposal:

Display of illuminated content on digital screens integrated within new communication Hub.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** advertisement consent for the following reason(s):

#### Reason(s) for Refusal

- 1 The proposed advertisement, by virtue of its location, scale, prominence, method of illumination, would add harmful visual clutter, detrimental to the amenity of the streetscene and the Hatton Garden Conservation Area, including a number of positive contributors located opposite (Cavendish Mansions, 170-178 Clerkenwell Road and Gray's Inn Buildings, Rosebery Avenue), and be harmful to the setting of a Grade II listed building (Yorkshire Grey Public House, 2-6 Theobald's Road), contrary to policies D1 (Design), D2 (Heritage) and D4 (Advertisements) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

- 2 The proposed advertisement, by virtue of its location, scale, prominence, and method of illumination, would introduce a distraction to traffic and pedestrians, causing harm to highway and public safety, contrary to Transport for London guidance, and to policies A1 (Managing the Impact of Development), D4 (Advertisements) and T1 (Prioritising walking, cycling and public transport) of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraph 38 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2021.
