I wish to object strongly to the planning application above to 'fell to the ground' two mature healthy trees in the area behind number 102-4 Albert Street NW1 7NE.

This is a conservation area and we should be saving all the mature trees we possibly can. The garden area between the West side of Arlington Road and the East side of Albert Street north is a large enclosed area of abundant green growth. There is amongst this a small number of large mature trees giving the space a wonderful feeling of unbounded nature. We have a large number of animal species that live here. Recently Camden has suffered the loss of many trees due to the HS2 project and we should be extolling them not exterminating them wherever we can.

Please save these trees by issuing them with preservation orders.
