The current Parliament Hill sideline needs to be preserved. Allowing further tower blocks to go up to 14 stories will block this site Line to the river. This is already the case with the single white towel block on the other side of Queens Crescent. There is a case for some raised housing units within the estate but residents have clearly spoken within the Neighbourhood assembly, held in the last two years, how they do not wish to see more tower blocks going up within this area. this consultation can be accessed by Camden who ran the consultation to highlight how high-rise blocks are not liked or encouraged in any replanning and redevelopment. Allowing tower blocks of height will not. only block the sideline which is a protected space, but will also create an island I saw within Kentish town which will lead to massive new developments. This will change forever the nature of this previously working class and industrial area which currently preserves this heritage. Please add these objections and reconsider any housing above recently approved buildings, e.g. recent developments at chalk farm.
