### Ambassadors Theatre is a Grade II listed designated heritage asset.

# 2. DESIGN

### 3.1 Ambassador Lounge Design

The existing second floor space of the Ambassadors Theatre is currently fitted out as staff spaces, including front of house staff office, changing/locker room, and break room containing catering facilities.

The stud partition walls were added in the 1970's and the décor updated as recently as 2021. The Heritage statement has identified that in order to achieve the proposed scheme, two small sections of original wall and the existing chimney breasts will need to be removed. All significant Heritage elements, including the window architraves and cast-iron fire surround are to be retained. In the case of the fire surround, it is proposed that this will be relocated and re-installed elsewhere in the space following the removal of the chimney breasts (assuming no issue with the asbestos removal in the local area)

ATG Entertainment propose to fit out the space in the typical aesthetic applied to all Ambassador Lounges on our portfolio of venues. This is to include new decoration, carpet, ceilings, furniture and fittings in keeping with many of its other theatres, including the Lyceum Theatre, Apollo Victoria Theatre, and Harold Pinter Theatre Lounges, all refurbished between 2023 and 2024.

#### Colour Scheme

All Ambassador Lounges are decorated in a dark green colour scheme, with gold detailing picked out on door frames, window frames and any decorative panelling.

#### <u>Joinery</u>

All joinery is to be new, formed from a Solid Corian (or similar) stone counter and MFMDF cupboards at low level.

#### <u>Mirrors + FF+E</u>

All mirrors and loose FF+E will feature gold detailing, all furniture is to be of commercial grad and meet the relevant fire regulations.

#### Lighting

New Ceiling pendants, wall sconce, and recessed ceiling LED spotlights are to be installed as part of the fitout.

#### Flooring

New commercial carpet is to be installed throughout the Lounge space, with new Karndean luxury-vinyl-tile (LVT) to be installed in the new washroom.

#### <u>Ceilings</u>

New MF plasterboard ceilings to be installed as necessary, with decorative cornicing installed at the junction between walls and ceilings.

#### <u>Walls</u>

Walls to be retained and decorated as necessary



### **4. ACCESS**

### 4.1 Lounge Access

Ambassador Lounge – Second Floor

The proposed Lounge scheme currently provides only marginally improved access and disability provisions as part of the works.

Due to the nature of the existing building, the Lounge is to be located on the second floor of the existing front of house space, which is only accessible via the existing front of house staircase.

Is should be noted that there is no lift access to this level of the building, and as such the Lounge will not be fully accessible. However on specific request, similar hospitality experiences can be provided in the Stalls Bar space, as this is fully wheelchair accessible following the installation of a new platform lift in 2022.

A hearing enhancement system, commonly known as a hearing loop provision is to be allowed for in the new Lounge space. The system will be clearly indicated with the relevant signage and will be available on request to any patrons using the Lounge space.

A new gender-neutral Lounge washroom is to be provided for the dedicated use of Lounge customers, however due to the lack of wheelchair access to this level of the building, this washroom will not meet full DDA requirements.
