**Subject:** Objection to intended works to tree in a conservation area

Dear Sir/Madam

I write with regards to your Notification of Intended Works to Tree(s) in a Conservation Area related to 10 Adamson Roas NW3 3HR (planning applications 2024/4785/T and 2024/4784/T). Please treat this email as a form of total objection and serious protest of your intention to fell an Elderflower tree (T9-C1) and a Portugal Laurel tree (T8-U) in the Rear Garden.

These trees are not only a defining feature of the street's natural environment but also provide essential habitats for a wide variety of wildlife. I regularly see squirrels using these trees for shelter and foraging, as well as a range of bird species, including robins, blue tits, and wood pigeons, nesting and feeding in their branches. Butterflies and bees are also frequently drawn to these trees, contributing to the area's biodiversity.

In addition to supporting local wildlife, the trees contribute significantly to the beauty of Adamson Road and act as a natural screen, preserving privacy between properties on Adamson Road and Eton Avenue. Their removal would be a great loss, both aesthetically and environmentally.

It's worth highlighting that other trees on this property have been granted Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) in recent years, and I believe these two trees should be afforded the same protection. These trees have stood for decades, and there is no clear justification for cutting them down now.

I strongly urge you to reject these proposals in the interest of preserving the natural heritage and ecological balance of the area.
