TWENTIETH-CENTURY DEVELOPMENTS

- In the early twentieth century, the large Strathcona mausoleum was constructed in 1914 near the north-west entrance of the East Side of the Cemetery, with the imposing Pocklington and Dalziel mausoleums following in 1930. Following the Great War, the War Memorial was erected to the north of the Colonnade in 1926. In terms of day-to-day management, the glasshouses within the Cemetery were removed to a new site at Townsend Yard in Highgate Village in 1905, in order to make way for more burials. This nursery area was sold in 1956 as part of an effort to reduce the growing commercial losses of the Company.
- 5.39 The toilet block located to the immediate south of the Anglican Chapel appears to have been built between 1915 and the early 1950s, judging by comparison of historic maps. This utilitarian structure has been altered since.




Figure 5.11 OS map, surveyed and published 1915 (source: ProMap)
