Unfortunately the olive tree in question, which we planted 15 years ago has already created structural damage to both the boundary wall and pier with our neighbours at #34. Part of the application also applies to ground floor windows, which have been similarly affected by ground movements. So we are very keen not to create situations where further damage can be done.  We are attached to the olive tree and have committed to either pot it (as is the case on many front gardens on Fitzjohns avenue) or plant it in our garden. Hence, we can confirm there will be no negative impact to the conservation area.
