Felling of 3 Ash Trees T1-T3 in rear garden of 46 Hillway.

T3 is suppressed due to its location between T2 and an off-site ash tree beyond the northern flank.

T2 and T3 have some limited dieback and Ash Dieback Disease which is observed in adjacent trees to the north (not part of this Notification) will impact on the remaining life-expectancy of the ash trees T1-T3.

T1 is growing very close to the top of a 2m high flank retaining wall that needs to be rebuilt.

The retaining walls within the rear garden of 46 Hillway are also failing and need to be replaced.

To be clear as part of this notification we are not claiming that the damage to the walls is due to the trees, but undertaking significant construction works in the rear garden and along the flank boundary of 46 Hillway whilst trying to retain trees that have limited remaining life-expectancy due to ADD is not considered a sensible course of action .

With regard to the limited access to the rear garden, safely removing the trees once ADD has progressed will be very difficult, due to the brittle nature of the timber.

The owner of 46 Hillway is willing to plant suitable replacement trees within the rear garden.

The trees can be observed from Makepeace Gardens to the south but there are more trees to the north of T3 which will limit the impact on amenity and character and appearance of the area. The topography of the site and overlapping tree canopies makes obtaining photos of dieback difficult.

Please contact me if you require any further information.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
  - o mark and name surrounding roads
  - o sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
  - o add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)

If it is impossible to identify the tree(s) accurately on the plan (e.g. because they are part of a woodland or group of trees), please identify their approximate location on the plan and provide details of how the tree(s) are marked on site (e.g. high visibility tape, tree tags, paint, etc); trees must not be marked by scarring or cutting into the bark.
