Luxor Lodge has been much altered internally since 1900 although it is barely noticeable today when viewed from Elsworthy Road nor when compared to an original photograph taken at that time. It is therefore much appreciated that changes to the proposal were made post the pre application consultation, thus retaining the asymmetry and the original fenestration design and scale of the front façade. William Willett would again despair that a basement is proposed when he campaigned so hard to avoid even domestics working, never mind sleeping, below ground level That is a lost caused in the 21st century.

There is no detail at this stage of the future front drive treatment but it is very much hoped that the existing low wall and railings, disguised by privet hedges, will be repeated

Four flats and potentially eight cars will regrettably leave no room for soft landscaping but at least the driveway can be a permeable material. There needs to be sufficient provision for eight refuse bins or the equivalent. Over the road at no. 43 the bins are left permanently on the pavement. An unwanted feature of the CA.
