It is notable that the front wall has been damaged by the trees for more than a decade and left unrepaired. CRASH notes permission was given to reduce the height of them four years ago but it would seem that this work was never carried out. CRASH does not object to the proposed reduction in height to previous points but does object to felling of T1 which is the largest of the trees. Damage to front garden walls and lifting of paving stones in a front garden should not be adequate enough reason for felling this mature tree. |
