This poses a significant public hazard. In November a large branch broke off and fell on to my car causing significant damage. Three weeks ago, another large branch broke off and fell on to the pavement. Had someone been underneath, it would have caused very serious and significant injuries.  With Camden's permission, the owners of the property have maintained and pollarded this cherry tree, paying particular attention to keeping it free of ivy (something that was a problem under the previous owner). Sadly however, the tree seems to have reached such a state of decay that it presents a risk of injury to pedestrians and potential damage to nearby property. Any replanting/replacement would have to carefully consider the risk to the nearby utilities, such as water, gas and broadband.
