The hill is made of clay soil, 'with movement'. As with any subterranean work on clay soil the proposed building of a pool under No 28 will increase the risk of subsidence in the area. The house is semidetached and shares a wall with the neighbouring house on its left side. It is otherwise surrounded by Victorian houses. Surely, it would make sense to leave the foundations of these homes as undisturbed as possible.  The other point I'd like to make is that No 28 is within 20 minutes walk of the Men's, the Women's and the Mixed Ponds on the Heath. It's even closer to the Parliament Hill Lido.
