Good morning Sarah,

Thanks for your email.

I'm the neighbor in 37C which is the neighboring lower ground flat, essentially the black door on page 7 in the submitted application (attached).

To complement the photos which you have seen in the application please see below pictures from my garden which hopefully give an Idea of the risk of light blockage in case of an extension which is 93cm above the wall. For reference the existing wall (the brick part of which) is c.1.4m so 93cm on top would represent a significant barrier my understanding. As you can see during spring and summer the trees in the front cover the front angle which means that most of the light (which is already rather limited in that side of the flat) comes from that side.

I expected an extension's ceiling to be much lower so that there is no impact on light, similar to the extension of my neighbor opposite side (13 Crossfield) but that plan seems quite aggressive.
