The Daylight and Sunlight Assessment shows that we will be loosing 25% of sunlight to our garden except in midsummer when the sun is directly over head. As it is, the building already shades 25% of the garden so this will account for a massive 50% overshadowing. Altering the sunlight available throughout any point in the year, even by a fraction, has serious ramifications to the species inhabiting The Phoenix Garden- especially bee and insect species. The garden is a patchwork of shade and sun through the year as a result of the neighbouring buildings and we manage the garden to maximise on the areas of sunlight to provide habitat. We have recorded over ten species of bee resident at the garden along with small garden birds and countless other insects all coexisting in our tiny ecosystem. The reduction in sunlight to the south will radically alter the ambiance of the garden, creating an uninviting dark space. Our visitors describe the garden as a quiet oasis, and the benefit from the peace, the sun and the open sky. If this development goes ahead, our garden will never recover.
