We live at 23 Gloucester Crescent and believe that many of the local antisocial behaviour issues can be improved by transforming and occupying neglected properties on Inverness Street and on Gloucester Crescent.</p> <p>23 Gloucester Crescent was unoccupied and neglected for a number of years, and during this time our garden wall was used as a rubbish bin and meeting place. Since the house has been restored and occupied as a family home, we have seen a significant improvement in antisocial behaviour outside our home.</p> <p>The design itself is elegant, light and sympathetic to the neighbouring buildings. It will be a much needed improvement to the derelict old building there currently, and is considerably better than the design on the previous (rejected) application.</p>

The proposed building will back onto the row of gardens coming up to my house and will be visible from my upper ground floor garden door (ie I can currently see across the gardens to Inverness St).</p> <p>I strongly support the proposed development. It would:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) make good use of a structure which has been derelict for many years; b) be a sensitive addition to the neighbourhood, preserving the view I (and neighbours) have through to Inverness Street and the sense of depth, layers and light which we currently enjoy. c) provide a subtle but distinctive architectural addition to the street and neighbourhood. <p>I should add that although I did not personally oppose the previous development application, I do consider this to be superior, both in the quality of the design and in the fact that it will preserve sight through to Inverness Street. I also believe that the scheme proponents are sensitive to the concerns of neighbours and have sought to develop a proposal which will enhance both Inverness St and the relevant section of Gloucester Crescent.</p>
