They also assumed that no-one sleeps in those rooms. This would seem to suggest that they believe there will be noise and disruption as a direct result of this development. For the record, I did raise this oversight with the designers/developers when they canvassed the building. Unfortunately, my calls were not followed up after one telephone correspondence with them. To be clear, The majority of us here use the rooms at the rear of the property and at all hours. Equally, It has not been considered by Camden or the developers that the residents have in recent months been constantly bombarded with very loud amplified sounds on Earlham Street from Pedicabs (from early evening to very late at night) and in the last few weeks some of the market stall holders are using amplified sound as well. In fact many residents sometimes take refuge in the rear of the building (as well as the front) create application of any noise going on there. This is exasperated by the design of Earlham House as well. In Earlham Street, for example, above street level, audio levels of 75 to 90 db have been recorded. So, the idea of a roof top gathering space going on until 8.00PM will undoubtedly make matters much worse. I would implore you to re-think this.
