Proposal:

Replacement of windows on the front, side and rear elevations at first floor level.

Drawing Nos: 1590-001-PL; 1590-002-PL; 1590-003-PL-A.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

- 1 The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

- 2 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: 1590-001-PL; 1590-002-PL; 1590-003-PL-A.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

- 3 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

Informative(s):

- 1 Reasons for granting permission.

The host building is a two-storey plus attic semi-detached property on the south side of Lymington Road. The road is characterised by large semi-detached Edwardian houses with random stone walls and brick piers, except for nos. 14 and 16 which were rebuilt some time before the 1970's. The property is also located in the West End Green Conservation Area and described as a positive contributor in the West End Green Conservation Area Appraisal adopted in February 2011.

The existing aluminium windows would be replaced with timber windows at first floor level.

Revisions were received with regard to the material for the windows as the original proposal was for the replacement to uPVC windows which was unacceptable in terms of design and sustainability. All of the windows on the front, side and rear elevations are now proposed to be replaced in timber to the satisfaction of officers. This would also accord with planning permission (2011/2325/P) that was granted on 4th August 2011 for the replacement of steel windows at 1st and 2nd floor level with timber framed windows on the front elevation.

These replacement windows would match as closely as possible the existing windows in terms of colour, frame sizes, opening methods and proportions.

Overall therefore, the proposals are considered to be sympathetic to and in keeping with the existing appearance of the host property in terms of the design, locations, and proportions, and would preserve the character and appearance of the building and West End Green Conservation Area in which it is located, and as such, is acceptable.

There are no amenity concerns to neighbouring properties given the proposal would replace existing building features and fenestration.

The site's planning and appeals history has been taken into account when coming to this decision. The West End Green CAAC and the Fortune Green & West Hampstead Neighbourhood Forum were consulted but did not comment.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the West End Green Conservation Area, under

s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act [ERR] 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policies A1, CC1, D1 and D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017 and policies 2 and 3 of the Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan 2015, the London Plan 2021 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2024.

- 2 Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts that cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. You are advised to consult the Council's Building Control Service, Camden Town Hall, Judd St, Kings Cross, London NW1 2QS (tel: 020-7974 6941).
- 3 This approval does not authorise the use of the public highway. Any requirement to use the public highway, such as for hoardings, temporary road closures and suspension of parking bays, will be subject to approval of relevant licence from the Council's Streetworks Authorisations & Compliance Team, 5 Pancras Square c/o Town Hall, Judd Street London WC1H 9JE (Tel. No 020 7974 4444). Licences and authorisations need to be sought in advance of proposed works. Where development is subject to a Construction Management Plan (through a requirement in a S106 agreement), no licence or authorisation will be granted until the Construction Management Plan is approved by the Council.
- 4 All works should be conducted in accordance with the Camden Minimum Requirements - a copy is available on the Council's website (search for 'Camden Minimum Requirements' at www.camden.gov.uk) or contact the Council's Noise and Licensing Enforcement Team, 5 Pancras Square c/o Town Hall, Judd Street London WC1H 9JE (Tel. No. 020 7974 4444)

Noise from demolition and construction works is subject to control under the Control of Pollution Act 1974. You must carry out any building works that can be heard at the boundary of the site only between 08.00 and 18.00 hours Monday to Friday and 08.00 to 13.00 on Saturday and not at all on Sundays and Public Holidays. You must secure the approval of the Council's Noise and Licensing Enforcement Team prior to undertaking such activities outside these hours.

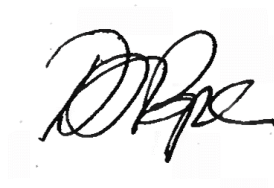
