

Hi! I'm a resident of the Camden Square Gardens area and I'm writing on planning application 2025/1301/P.

I have a disabled child that we are working to place in full-time education. In the meantime, one of our most important activities is a regular outing to this park to use the gym equipment that is available to the public. Will access to this be preserved and/or expanded?

One of the biggest challenges in Camden is the lack of public space that is available in the evenings during the winter months. When it is dark so early, it's important to have spaces where we can take our kids to run around. I'm hoping this application (which mentions floodlit padel court) will extend the floodlit area to include the play space and exercise equipment to expand access. If not, could you please consider it?

Hello

I understand that the commenting period for planning application 2025/1301/P (replace play area/sand pit with panel courts) is closed.

I do have an observation about the park whatever the outcome of the application.

It would be helpful to provide more benches that have a good view of the skatepark area, ideally in the shade.

Additional benches would allow adults escorting children using the skate park to supervise their children without having to sit or stand in full sunlight and without making the skate area more crowded with people not skating.

The existing benches in the shade do not have a good view of the whole of the skatepark, only one small corner, and the one bench that does have a good view of the main bowl (only) is in full sun during majority of opening hours of skatepark.

Also can the toilets be opened consistently during opening hours of skatepark.

I would object to the skatepark being removed, made bootable, or a charge levied.
