Proposal:

Erection of rear dormer, formation of terrace at rear second floor, and alterations to side window.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed dormer, by reason of its detailed design and size set within a largely unimpaired roofscape would harm the character and appearance of the host building, the terrace of which it forms part and this part of the Bartholomew Estate Conservation Area, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.



The proposed roof terrace, by reason of its size, location and proximity to residential dwellings, would increase opportunities for overlooking of, and noise disturbance to neighbouring properties, contrary to Policy CS5 (Managing the impact of growth and development) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and Policy DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
