Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The pergola at upper ground floor level and proposed glazed enclosure, by reason of its size, siting and detailed design, is detrimental to the character and appearance of the host building and terrace and fails to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of the Hampstead Conservation Area contrary to policies CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough



of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
