					However, we have some concerns.	
		NW3 2JB			As neighbours we are located immediately next the nursery. Our house over-looks the nursery and we can also see across to the houses on Rona and Savernake Roads. The design of the extension is planning to change the colour of the building to a " white through render to the facades. We oppose this because the immediate built environment is victorian brick, and a white building would not sit easily within the historical setting of the Conservation Area. We disagree with the comments in the planning application (Design and Access Statement; 3.7 appearance) that state white render is used commonly in this environment. The photos used as examples are all at least 1 or 2 streets away from the nursery and only one example is actually in the Mansfield Conservation Area. None of these white rendered examples can be seen from the nursery. We would like the colour and material of the of the building to re re-considered.	
					We are also concerned about the number of trees that are to be felled. We see from the Tree Report that tree numbers 8, 9, 10, and 11 are to be felled. The trees, (number 7,8,9,10,11,12,13) in the " Tree Report" protect our home from the noise of the nursery, the school, and noise of the Gospel Oak Overground. The trees are directly behind our house, They provide a beautiful habitat for birds as well as providing a noise barrier. We would like the trees to be retained.	
					It was mentioned during the community meeting at Gospel Oak School, that construction could be restricted to a five day working week which would exclude the weekends. We would support this as it would be considerate to the local residents.
