The temporary Viewing Platform was erected in its current location in May 2013. The table opposite shows usage figures for the platform, between the launch date of the Varini art installation on 16th May 2013 and 8th December 2013. The figures are divided into monthly totals, with a total of 111,628 visitors during the period as a whole.

Varini's art installation was removed from Granary Square in October 2013. The usage figures however show that the Viewing Platform has continued to attract visitors in its own right following the removal of the piece. It is a valuable asset to the KXC site which attracts and informs visitors in respect of the King's Cross Central development and wider area, and makes a valuable contribution to the northern end of the active and lively King's Boulevard.
