Given the fundamental policy requirement that proposals should âpreserve or enhanceâ the character and appearance of the conservation area, we object to the introduction of the âproposed treated panel cladding with pale cream finishâ to the proposed rear conservatory. It appears to introduce an element more akin to a shop fascia than the rear of a domestic building, harming the traditional relationship between the front and rear of the building, and between domestic and commercial uses. A more traditional material, like lead or zinc, or a lead or zinc finish, might be acceptable in this location.
