Assessment

Proposal

The application relates to two fascia signs with internally illuminated lettering, to the ground floor front and side elevation of the 'Fat Face' store at Euston Station.

Design

The display of 2 x fascia signs with internally illuminated letters. The first sign would be located above the main entrance at ground floor level. The proposed sign would be internally illuminated with white letters on a grey background, reading 'Fat Face, United Kingdom'.

The second sign would be located above the internal mall entrance at ground floor level; the sign would also be white text and grey background and include internally illuminated letters, reading 'Fat Face, United kingdom'.

The Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007 permits the Council to only consider amenity and public safety matters in determining advertisement consent applications.

Amenity

The proposed signs will replace existing 'Fat Face' signs of a similar size and are considered nonobtrusive at this location. The signs do not obscure any architectural features of the building and are considered acceptable in terms of proportions and design.

It is not considered that the sign would be unduly obtrusive in the street scene or disturb residents or occupiers at this location.

Public Safety

The location of the signage is not considered harmful to either pedestrian or vehicle traffic. The proposal therefore raises no public safety concerns.

Recommendation:

The proposed advert is in general compliance with policies CS14, DP24 and DP25 of the Local Development Framework the application is therefore recommended for approval.
