The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed two storey extension, by reason of its height, bulk and detailed design, would be detrimental to the special architectural and historic interest of the host building, and character and appearance of Dartmouth Park Conservation Area, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage)



Award Projects Ltd 35 Paul Street London EC2A 4UQ of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's Heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

2 The proposal, in the absence of an arboricultural impact assessment or method statement, has failed to demonstrate there would be no harm to significant trees on the site, contrary to policy CS15 (Protecting and improving open spaces & encouraging biodiversity) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.
