With reference to Planning Application 2013/5813/P.  
I wish to object to the above plan for the following reason:

My ground floor bedroom has a window that overlooks the passage between my house and the property next door - No. 72.

This window faces due SOUTH and has been completely - and conveniently - overlooked for the 'Daylight/Sunlight' report that can be found on the Planning Application for No. 72.

The same report talks about the 'acceptable' figure of a 20% loss of daylight that may be incurred as a result of the planned, new extensions. My window is an ORIGINAL window and the existing, ORIGINAL, bay window at No. 72, already obscures 50% of the daylight that enters my bedroom. ANY alteration to that bay, outwards, or upwards, will remove 100% of the daylight entering my room. That is totally unacceptable.
