Response:

I have concerns about his application for several reasons:

- The impact of heavy construction lorries in Millfield Lane – pedestrians, cyclists, dog walkers, children, runners etc are all at risk.
 - Other traffic to and from the site using Millfield Lane also pose a risk, including fumes and noise in what is a tranquil and pollution-free natural space.
 - Large vehicles turning at the entrance to the Water House opposite the pond entrance - complete madness! There simply isn't room.
 - “Improvements” to the lane to make it suitable for heavy traffic are NOT WANTED. It is a natural lane intended for walking and cycling. People who use the Heath prefer its current natural state, plus lanes like this one are few and far between in London these days, so must be preserved.
 - There is a strong possibility of damage to plant life either side of the lane caused by traffic.
 - The construction work could well have a negative impact on water quality, not to mention noise and dust. We already suffer noise from nearby work at Fitzroy Farm.
