Assessment

Proposal

The application relates to an internally illuminated projecting pharmacy sign. This type of signs do not normally require consent, but in this case the illumination is non-static and therefore consent is required.

The Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007 permits the Council to only consider amenity and public safety matters in determining advertisement consent applications.

Amenity

The sign does not obscure any architectural features of the building and is considered acceptable in terms of proportions and design. It is not considered that the sign would be unduly obtrusive in the street scene or disturb residents or occupiers. The proposed illumination is considered acceptable given that the premises are a pharmacy and the lights are not flashing.

Public Safety

The location of the signage is not considered harmful to either pedestrian or vehicle traffic. The proposal therefore raises no public safety concerns.

Recommendation:

The proposed advert is in general compliance with policies CS14, DP24 and DP25 of the Local Development Framework the application is therefore recommended for approval.

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
