The students Arches at the North and South ends of Chester Terrace, each such having three some-sircular headed and four fluted pilasters with coristhian capitals and four three quarter fluted columns. Moulded establature on both sides, with moulded cornice and modillions and paternes, foliated enriched frieze panel on one side, and lettered frieze panel on opposite side lettered Chester Ferrace.

The archway to the North and of Chapter Terrace Mows, with two three querter fluted columns with Doris Capitals, plain frieze and noulded pediment.

The double hung window with each upper aach divided into three squares and two slips, and each bottom much divided into six squares and four slips.

The false window in stucco, moulded and painted to simulate a double hung semiscircular headed window.

MARCHAL ASBORT

The fluted three quarter columns, and the fluted pilasters with Corinthian Capitale, and the moulded entablature at second floor level.

The moulded string course at third floor level and the moulded cornics to the parapet.

The sticgood balustrade with bottle shaped balusters and plain dies on the south elevation.

The portion to the front entrance doors with three square stuccoed columns and three stuccoed pilasters.

The cast iron balconnetto railings to the first floor windows.

The east iron millings to the garden boundary wall, with wouldnot belustors of a design common to Nos. 3, 40, and 41 and 42 Chaster Terrace.
