Site Description

Large hospital built in 1970's with entrance and service access off Pond Street and its western façade with plant rooms etc faces Hampstead Green. Borders Hampstead CAAC along this frontage and is near Grade 2* listed St Stephens church to the west.

Assessment

This case is a resubmission from a previous scheme for roof plant here which was withdrawn following officers' advice that the roof top structure extension with bridge across the podium was too bulky and prominent in views from Pond St. It has been accordingly revised so that most of the new plant is now housed within the structure.

The application relates to an exposed lift/staircase tower on the NW corner of the podium level of the main hospital as it faces Pond St carpark and service road. This tower is slightly separated by a gap from the main podium and has a large bulkhead on top of which is a smaller protruding extract shaft. The facade along the SW side of the podium facing Hampstead Green has a 1970's Brutalist style in concrete but its coherence has been eroded over time with various alterations and additions of plant etc.

The proposal now involves adding an enclosure to the roof of the plantroom to house energy-recovery equipment for the AHU area which is being refurbished; this will recover heat energy from the existing extract ventilation system shaft and will allow reduction of 225 tonnes of CO2 emissions. Externally, the new room will be added behind the existing projection on the tower bulkhead facing Hampstead Green; a maintenance access walkway will bridge the gap between the bulkhead and podium plus safety railings added to the roof of podium; a louvred panel will be added to the western facade of the bulkhead facing the church.

Although the new enclosure is slightly higher than the existing projection, this increased height will not be apparent from Pond St. Although the rear-ward projection will be visible across the gap from Pond St, this is considered acceptable as a minor extension above the tower bulkhead- it is well set back from Pond St façade and reads as a subservient extension to the tower; it is still separate from the podium and, unlike the previous proposal, does not bridge the gap so that it does not result in coalescing the tower with the podium element in terms of overall bulk. The access walkway is very lightweight and well set back from Pond St façade and will have limited visibility and indeed minimal impact on the overall hospital bulk and form. The enclosure will be entirely visible from the western facade facing the Green but again this reads as a sympathetic extension to the service tower in conjunction with the existing projection here. The louvred panel below is also considered acceptable as a minor façade alteration. As noted above, the impact on the Brutalist style of this facade is acceptable given that its coherence and quality has been diminished by past alterations. Materials in metal cladding panels will be coloured to blend in with the existing building.

The plant will have no impact on the character of the adjoining conservation area and setting of the nearby listed church.

The plant has no moving parts or machinery as this is purely for air extraction and thus no noise will be generated. There will be no impact on neighbouring light, outlook or background noise levels.

The scheme is thus acceptable in design, bulk, heritage and amenity terms.

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
