The site is a Scheduled Ancient Monument (SAM GL130) because a medieval nunnery, St Mary Clerkenwell, occupied the site between 1144 and 1538. As a result archaeological monitoring was required during building works. Excavations to the south and east had revealed postholes of a timber structure of 12th century date and a masonry wall of 12th century date considered to have belonged to the nunnery. Both features were seen to extend beneath the property.

Medieval remains consisted of numerous pits and wells found in three discrete areas, no doubt originally located in the backyards of buildings fronting Smithfield Street and Hosier Lane. Some of the earliest features were almost certainly quarry pits, for the extraction of sand and gravel. Based on the pottery evidence, two main groups of pits can be identified, one group dating to the late 13th and early 14th centuries, and a slightly larger group of late 14th century date. Pits of both groups were located in each of the three excavation areas, with no distinction in terms of the pattern of distribution between them. This suggests that the area was first laid out and occupied in the late 13th or early 14th century, with major property boundaries subsequently maintained throughout the medieval period. In addition, a small number of 15th and 16th century pits were located, though

others may have been truncated by later development on the site.

Post-medieval remains dating to before the late 19th century redevelopment of the site were less well represented, largely consisting of below ground brick structures such as wells and drains. A number of brick features, mainly drains and wall foundations, are dated to the 18th and early 19th centuries. A series of brick drains of early 19th century date were located across the southern part of the site. The site was redeveloped in the late 19th century. Buildings on the site were destroyed in the Blitz and the site left open until the present development.

The site is situated within the eastern portion of Middle Saxon trading settlement of Lundenwic. The Middle Saxon features (AD 730-850) consisted of one wattle-lined well, a number of cesspits and rubbish pits, while structural evidence consisted of shallow postholes and a timber building. There were two superimposed areas of gravel yard metalling, plus external dumps of daub rich, organic rubbish. Saxon finds included pottery, fragments of loomweights and lava quernstones. One large ditch (aligned north-west to south-east) is Middle or Late Saxon in date.

During the medieval period the site was farmland, this period of activity was represented by a build-up of topsoil.

In c.1630 a large residence known as 'Wild House' was built on the western portion of the site, while within the eastern portion of the site (where the excavations were carried out) formal gardens were laid out. It is likely that the garden was represented on site by the later topsoil horizons.

During the 18th century 'Wild house' was replaced by rows of small, brick-built cellared houses, which remained in use until the late 19th century. The cellar walls of these houses and their internal features, including one well, several drains and various brick lined cesspits and soakaways, were well preserved. Finds from these features included masses of domestic pottery, clay pipes and a gold finger ring.

A sequence of conversions occurred; from high status residential accommodation, to mixed use under the occupancy of two doctors, to low status residential accommodation as a hostel for warehousemen, to primarily office accommodation in the early 20th century and finally to wholly commercial usage after World War Two.

During the early 19th century it was largely refurbished and the internal spaces rearranged for the use by the physicians. The principle rooms were given highly elaborate cornice mouldings as well as panelling and a dumb waiter. However the building appears to have deteriorated rapidly from this point and towards the end of the century the southeast corner of the structure was replaced and window frames modernised. The garden was sold off and redeveloped and the house refronted.

During the early 20th century a ground floor meeting room was added removing the closet wing and introducing a reinforced concrete slab floor. In the late 20th century modern panels and ceilings were added to cover the historic furnishings.

Disarticulated human bone located within the post-medieval contexts was interpreted as possible evidence of disturbance of the medieval hospital cemetery. A single sherd of medieval pottery was located within a post medieval context.

Post medieval made ground was observed beneath the basement slab as well as two areas of mortuary foundations.

The contractor indicated that the site lay on an area of some archaeological potential for all periods. However the evaluation in 2004 demonstrated that the basement of the present building will have removed much of the horizontal stratigraphy, and the site is almost entirely limited to alluvial deposits and foreshore gravels from the Fleet River.

The area of greatest archaeological potential is the west, as deposits are likely to have been completely truncated in the east, though the bases of deeply cut features such as pits and wells cannot be ruled out. The most significant impact on archaeological deposits is likely to come from piles and pile caps in the western part of the basement, which may partially or completely remove any surviving deposits. The perimeter ground beam and basement slab will probably have only a minimal impact.
