The earliest features were 16th/17th century intercutting gravel extraction pits, largely concentrated in the northwest.

The excavation of the cemetery identified 18 gravestones between 1786 and 1845 and 692 east-west aligned burials. The majority of the burials were in coffins of varying states of preservation, and two had directly associated legible breastplates. Several had evidence of personal ornaments and dress accessories including buttons, beads, earrings, rings and hair ornaments, as well as shoes, wig curlers, coins, watches, pipe, glass, bone and pottery sherds.

Following the abandonment of the burial ground construction work in the 19th century truncated the south of the site, and disturbed burials were re-interred in a charnel pit in the northeast corner of the site.

No grave cut could be detected. A second collection of human bone had been recovered from the north-south trench, close to its southern end. At least five individuals were recorded. All the burials had been truncated above the waist and none are likely to have been articulated. It is thought likely that this represented evidence for the Pardon Churchyard, documented in the 14th century and originally designed for victims of the Black Death.

Pottery evidence dated this feature to before 1270-1300 AD.

It is uncertain whether the burial was a Black Death burial or later burial, though the stratigraphic position and dating evidence does suggest that it dates to the Black Death period in the 14th century.

Levelling and dumping in the square seems to have taken place after 1630 and before 1700.

The remains of two possible service buildings or temporary accommodation from the initial foundation of the Carthusian Charterhouse monastery were recorded, with external wall footings of chalk and mortar that may have supported a half-timber superstructure.

These buildings went out of use and the ground was raised prior to the construction of a two room building that may have been part of a range bisecting the outer court of the monastery, potentially barns, storehouses or stables. These appear to have been contemporary with the earliest precinct wall of around 1480.

Two phases of alterations in brick appear to date to the reuse of the structures from the mid 16th century as ancillary buildings to Lord North's mansion, situated immediately southeast. In addition a new range of service buildings were constructed in brick against the precinct wall to the north after the Dissolution. These were converted in the early 17th century into accommodation for the resident Brothers of Sutton's Hospital.
