In 1998-9 a series of pile caps and shafts were excavated in advance of piling and others were monitored. The Roman city wall was surveyed in 1998. A large open area, a number of ground beam trenches and pile caps and shafts in King Edward's Buildings, sewer-heading trenches under Giltspur Street, Newgate Street and King Edward Street and three more trenches at Christ Church Greyfriars were excavated in 1999-2000. Six trenches were opened in Christ Church Greyfriars in 1998. The foundations of Christ Church were evaluated in 1999. In 2000, seven test pits were dug through the road surfaces of King Edward Street, Newgate Street and Warwick Lane. A bastion on the Roman wall was filled in in 2000. A lift pit was excavated in the basement of 114 Newgate Street in 2001. Four trenches were excavated and monitored at Greyfriars in 2001. All this work was carried out by the Museum of London Archaeology Service. Three site codes were amalgamated into KEW98 (KEB92 and GCC98). Prehistoric stream channels were encountered, and residual worked flints dated to the Late Neolithic or Early Bronze Age. Remains of early Roman buildings were found. The Roman wall and Silchester Road bisected the site. Saxo-Norman activity was identified in the form of lined pits and an early city ditch, dated 1000-1200 with later recuttings. A bastion was added to the Roman wall c. 1230-1300. A fragment of Greyfriars Friary was recovered, from the 1306-1327 rebuild. The city ditch was backfilled in the fifteenth century and provided new living space in the post-medieval period. The Great Fire destroyed many buildings. The ruins of Wren's Christ Church Greyfriars are preserved on site. The internal faces of the tank were rendered with a pitch like substance. The tank was sealed by a decayed raft of timber under the later basement slab. Later white, glazed brick tanks were observed in the north and east of the site were present beneath the slab of the former building. These were cut

The first pit was 1m square and situated in the light well east of the Hall's kitchens and it was found that the hall was built into loose ash representing domestic waste. The second was on the terrace next to the eastern retaining, 1.6m by 0.6m. below the made ground was the same ashy deposit, along with oyster shell and pig bones. The boreholes were on the south and north ends of the terrace in which the ash was again encountered. This was probably part of a dump that was reworked to create the terrace. At the south end a large, chalk-lined Tudor cess-pit containing two Coarse Borderware jugs, fragments of glass urinals and two Cheam whiteware crucibles was excavated. A seventeenth century pit and an eighteenth century brick-lined cess-pit were also excavated in this area. In the north a brick drain channelled water down the slope and a foundation forming part of the cellar of a house were encountered.
