FRONT GARDEN: 3 x Lime - Pollard severely.

1 x Conifer - Clip.

REAR GARDEN: 1 x Cherry - Reduce back close to previous reduction points.

1 x Birch - Reduce back close to previous reduction points.

1 x Box Elder - Reduce back close to previous reduction points.

1 x Purple Plum - Reduce back close to previous reduction points. Reshape where parts have died.

1 x Apple - Reduce by 1m.

1 x Crab Apple - Reduce back close to previous reduction points.

1 x Crab Apple - Reduce by up to 1m.

1 x Red Japanese Maple - Reduce crown by up to 1m.

1 x Cut Leaf Maple - Lightly reduce.


The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 17 October 2012 and does not wish to object.
