With regard to the above condition, we confirm that the Institute of Education has advised the following:

As the extension would extend our existing Bedford Way building the current refuse storage area on the service road would be used. On the service road currently the Institute has a designated area for the storage of both waste to energy and recycled materials. This consists of a number of 1100 litre wheelie bins, which are emptied daily in regards to waste to energy and twice per week for recycled waste. In regards to general day-to-day waste the Institute does not send any waste to landfill.
