Assessment

1.0 Proposal:

1.1 Permission is sought for the replacement of the existing single glazed timber windows with double glazed timber windows. The client is London Borough of Camden.

2.0 Assessment:

2.1 The proposal would see all the windows on the east elevation replaced with timber framed double glazed sash windows. Camden Planning Guidance advises that where it is necessary to replace windows that are original or in the style of originals, they should be replaced like with like wherever possible. New windows should match the originals as closely as possible in terms of type, glazing patterns and proportions, opening method, materials and finishes, detailing and overall size of the window opening.

2.2 The proposal would comply with this guidance; the windows would be timber framed with an opening method to match existing and in terms of appearance would be of the same style as existing. Whilst the profiles may be slightly deeper to accommodate double it is not considered that this would negatively affect the appearance of the property or the wider area conservation area. The glazing bars on the new windows are much larger than the existing wnidows. However, with a large pane and planted glazing bars the windows can be manufactured to replicate the sight lines of the current timber windows. The proposed windows are therefore considered to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of the building and wider conservation area.
