## **Site Description**

The Western Goods Shed is located north-east of the Wharf Road Viaduct and immediately west of the Western Coal Drops, in the Goods Yard area of King's Cross. It is situated to the north of the canal, opposite St Pancras lock. The Western Goods Shed is unlisted and is located within the Regent's Canal Conservation Area.

The Western Goods Shed was built from 1897-99 as a two level goods station (freight depot). It was designed by Alexander Ross, the Great Northern Railway's Chief Engineer and built on top of the site of the Great Northern Railway's coal and stone basin. The shed was built to accommodate the increasing amount of freight in the Goods Yard.

The Western Goods Shed is a substantial brick goods station, 100m long north-south and 53m westeast with 15,555 sq m floor space over two floors and a mezzanine. Immediately adjoining to the east is the Western Coal Drops. The lower level has cast iron columns underneath steel plate girders, supporting the upper level.

The building is unlisted but lies within Regents Canal Conservation Area.

## **Relevant History**

Conservation Area Consent was granted on 22/12/06 for Demolition of the Western Goods Shed and the wall and fences abutting the South-West corner of the Western Goods Shed (ref:2004/2321/C).

Outline Planning Permission was granted on 22/12/06 for a comprehensive, phased, mixed-use development of former railway lands within the King's Cross Opportunity Area, as set out in the Revised Development Specification. The development comprises business and employment uses within the B1 use class; residential uses (including student accommodation), serviced apartments and hotels; shopping, food and drink and financial and professional services within the A1, A2, A3, A4 and A5 use classes; the full range of community, health, education, cultural, assembly and leisure facilities, within the D1 and D2 use classes; night clubs; multi storey and other car parking; re-erection of the linked triplet of gas holder guide frames to enclose new residential and other development, on the site of the Western Goods Shed; re-erection of the guide frame for gas holder no 8, alongside the re-erected triplet, to enclose new play facilities and open space; relocation of an existing district gas governor; works of alteration to other existing buildings and structures, to facilitate their refurbishment for specified uses; new streets and other means of access and circulation; landscaping including open space; new bridge crossings and other works along the Regent's Canal; the re-profiling of site levels; and other supporting infrastructure works and facilities (ref: 2004/2307/P).

An application was approved on 19/5/11 for the variation of condition 2(c) of conservation area consent dated 22nd December 2006 (ref. 2004/2321/C) for the demolition of the Western Goods Shed and the wall and fences abutting the South-West corner of the Western Goods Shed, namely to permit demolition work to take place once a contract has been placed for the works of dismantling, refurbishment and re-erection of the gas holder number 8 guide frame (ref: 2011/1526/P).

An application was approved on 1/8/12 for details pursuant to condition 3 (standing building survey report) and condition 4 (salvage schedule supporting document) of conservation area consent 2004/2321/C decided 22/12/2006 for the demolition of the Western Goods Shed and the wall and fences abutting the South-West corner of the Western Goods Shed (ref: 2012/3149/C).
