The site is not in a conservation area but is identified as Metropolitan Open Land.

#### **Assessment**

#### Overview

Parliament Hill Park café provides snacks and refreshments. There are internal and external seating areas, some of which are protected by a canopy projecting from the café building. It is proposed to extend the canopy to the side elevation of the café.

The café is very popular with visitors to Parliament Hill Fields and Hampstead Heath. There are increasing numbers of visitors with dogs using the heath. The City of London (COL) is aware of conflicts between people with dogs and other heath users, particularly children and people afraid of dogs.

The proposals create a separate segregated area, to the west side of the café, for dog handlers to use, thus reducing this conflict. The proposed canopy would provide a covered area for seating within the proposed dog handler's area, which would be contained within fencing and accessed through a gate.

The management of the arrangements would rely on voluntary co-operation by dog handlers, but would be supervised by the Superintendent's staff and the Hampstead Heath constabulary. Guide dogs and their handlers would not be required to have to use the segregated area.

The proposals are to create a segregated area with a new side canopy for seating for dog handlers. It is not an enlargement of the extent of the existing seating area. Some of the existing seating area would be under the new canopy. Dog handlers would have facilities that they can enjoy, such as a covered seating area, without having to share space with other heath users. Such segregated facilities have been incorporated in other similar public spaces and have been shown to successfully reduce conflict.

## Design & appearance / Impact on openness on the Heath

The canopy on the south west side to the café building has dimensions of 3.3m width x 8.0m length (26.4sqm) and would be similar to the existing canopy on the south-east side/ front of the host building. The proposed canopy width would be identical to the width of the host building.

The proposed canopy structure would match the height of the existing (2.8m). It is of a light-weight appearance and comprises, timber fascia, metal posts, felt roof covering with surface areas all painted to match the existing. The fenestration pattern on this elevation is similar to that of the front elevation and thus can easily incorporate a canopy structure of similar design. The absence of fixed walls would ensure that the canopy would not add visible bulk or detract from or cause harm to the appearance of the host building or the wholeness, or openness of the Heath.

The positioning of the proposed canopy to the west side of the café has the advantages of being able to utilise the existing fencing, seating and paving surfaces as well as being in close proximity to the café. The location is partly screened from other seating areas thus enabling other café users to sit out of sight of the dogs. The fenestration pattern on this elevation is similar to that of the front elevation and thus can easily incorporate a canopy structure of the same design. The fencing, gate and paved surfaces will be altered as shown on the drawings to allow easy access. The segregated area will help to make the café area safer for users, particularly perceived safety for people who are afraid of dogs.

As the host building is not located close to any residential properties the proposed canopy would not cause any harm on amenity grounds.

**Recommendation**: Grant planning permission
