CONSERVATION AREA**

Proposed Work:

- FRONT GARDEN: 1 x Yew - Prune to shape sides and height by no more than 1m.
REAR GARDEN: 1 x Leylandii & 1 x Hawthorn - Cut back branches overhanging 91
Redington Road back to boundary line.
1 x Oak - Reduce by 15%.
1 x Holm Oak - Reduce by 1m. Trim sides to shape.
1 x Sycamore - Thin crown by 25%.
1 x Sycamore - Reduce 3-4 overhanging branches and epicormic growth.
2 x Silver Birch - Reduce 2-4 limbs overhanging adjacent property to balance.
1 x Sycamore - Remove epicormic growth.
1 x Cypress - Reduce to 6ft. Trim sides.
2 x Lombardy Poplar - Cut overhanging branches and epicormic branches not higher than
15ft.
1 x Yew, 1 x Prunus - Fell to ground level.


The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 30 January
