Site Description

Grade II listed terrace building in the Bloomsbury Conservation Area, one of a terrace of 11 houses dating from c. 1807, by James Burton.

Assessment

It is proposed to erect a commemorative plaque to Vladimir Ilyich Lenin, who lived at the property in 1908. The plaque will take the form of a circular, blue-finished glazed ceramic, inscribed with the name and relevant date. It will measure c. 470mm in diameter by 15mm deep, and will be affixed to the brickwork at first floor level between the windows, using lime mortar.

The size, scale, position, finish and method of fixing of the plaque are not considered to cause harm to the special architectural or historic interest of the building. The relevant local and national policies are complied with, and approval is therefore recommended.

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
