Prune Lime (T 1) located at the Front of block according to the following specifications:

- Remove epicormic shoots to a height of 2-3 metres to manage regrowth.
  - Thin new crown to remove approximately 30% of live branches to reduce branch density.
- Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Remove resulting debris.

Prune Holly (T 2) located at the Front/corner according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Privet group (T 3) located at the Front/corner according to the following specifications:

- Shear to maintain new size of hedge.
- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Lime (T 4) located at the Front/Lynhurst Road according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

- Thin crown to remove approximately 30% of live branches to reduce branch density.

Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

- Remove epicormic shoots to a height of 3-4 metres to improve clearance.

Prune Lime (T 5) located at the Rear of block according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

- Thin crown to remove approximately 30% of live branches to reduce branch density.

Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

- Remove epicormic shoots to a height of 3-4 metres to improve clearance.

Prune Sycamore (T 6) located at the Rear of block according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

- Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 2-3 metres to manage volume.
