MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

This maintenance schedule considers the long-term maintenance required to sustain the roof level planting.

Weed Control

- Hand weeding raised planters.
- Within the first three years of establishment, a fine graded composted bark should be laid around the base of all young plants to suppress weed growth and should be maintained to a depth of 50mm. Between April and September an annual inspection of these areas should be undertaken, removing weeds wherever necessary by hand pulling to assist the successful establishment of plants.

Watering

Monitoring of irrigation requirements should be carried out throughout the year. Watering is required during periods of prolonged drought (in excess of 14 days). Particular care should be taken during such periods to ensure sufficient watering is carried out to facilitate healthy growth. Watering should not take place where local water restrictions are in place.

Pruning

• Climber tying in and pruning - annual operation in early spring.

Leaf litte

Remove all dead plant debris and leaf litter from planters, and hard surfaces - annual operation in late autumn.

Health & safety

All operations carried out on site must only be undertaken by trained personnel, using methods & equipment approved by the Health and Safety Executive. A method statement must be provided to the architect by the contractor covering all maintenance works prior to any work being undertaken. All operations must be carried out in accordance with the HSE "Working at Height' regulations and be suited to the sites access provision.
