2.0 Project Brief

I.I Project Description

The project scope is the removal and replacement of 3 no entrances to Shropshire House on Capper Street . The new entrance doors and side screens will be installed on the same perimeter line as the existing . The project will require temporary entrances and side screens to be installed during the Strip Out works, these temporary entrances will need to comply both with Part M of the building regulations and with any statutory requirements regarding Means of escape .

The 3 new Entrances will match both in style and detail the 2 no crittall type entrances . They will comprise of fully glazed 12mm thick toughened glass doors with stainless steel head and base channels on pivots , together with brushed stainless steel pull / push handles. The doors will be set within black metal glazing frames to match the existing .

All works to the 3 new entrances will comply with part M of the Building Regulations. All statutory requirements with regard to life safety systems and means of escape will be met, for both the temporary installations and the final screen installations.

The works will be taking place in an occupied building and the contractor will make every effort to minimise disruption to the occupiers.
