Town and Country Planning Acts 1990 (as amended) NO OBJECTION TO SECTION 211 NOTICE OF WORKS TO TREE/S IN A CONSERVATION AREA

Proposed Work:

Front Garden:

Silver Birch - Aprox. 1 5-2m Raise crown by removal of two low branches.

2 x Laurels in front bed - Fell to ground level and poison.

Dead Birch - Fell to ground level.

Unidentified dead tree - Fell to ground level.

Mixed hedge - Overhanging from neighboring property, trim to tidy and control encroachment, includes overhanging holly.

Lime - Overhanging from neighboring property, reduce overhanging branches only by 20-25% and thin remaining crown density by 20-25%

Lime - Overhanging from neighboring property, reduce overhanging branches only by 20-25% and thin remaining crown density by 20-25%

Beech - Overhanging from neighboring property, reduce over roof by 20%.

Rear Garden - Oak - Aprox. 17m - remove epicormic growth on main stem only.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 09 August 2011 and does not wish to object.
